Advanced approaches holding companies and Category III holding companies must complete item 52 only if the amount reported in Schedule HC-R, Part I, item 50.a, in the FR Y-9C report for the previous calendar quarter-end report date was less than or equal to the amount reported in Schedule HC-R, Part I, item 50.b, in the FR Y-9C report for that previous report date.

#### Part II. Risk-Weighted Assets

This schedule is to be submitted on a consolidated basis.

Holding companies (HC) are required to assign a 100 percent risk-weight to all assets not specifically assigned a risk-weight under Subpart D of the Federal Reserve's regulatory capital rules¹ and not deducted from tier 1 or tier 2 capital.

Items 1 through 25 (columns A through U, as applicable) are to be reported semiannually in June and December by holding companies with less than \$5 billion in total consolidated assets.<sup>2</sup>
